### Good Shephard (Vocation) Sunday.

In today's reading we hear proclaimed that Jesus describes his relationship with his followers as similar to the relationship between a good shepherd and his sheep. As a good shepherd will risk and lay down his life to protect his sheep, Jesus willingly sacrifices himself for the sake of His sheep.

All of this is intimately linked with today's second theme. Not only is it Good Shepherd Sunday, it is also "Vocations Sunday" established in 1964 by Pope Paul VI.

## The Word this Week

Today Jesus talks of himself as the Good Shepherd who lays down his life for his flock.
