Assessment/Testing

In KS2 children sit the NFER tests twice a year, once in Autumn 2 and again in Summer 1.

These test reading, spelling, SPAG and writing skills.

White Rose Maths tests are taken termly. These test arithmetic and reasoning/problem solving.

These form part of, an in school assessment to help us monitor your child's progress.

All children in Year 4 will complete the national Times Tables test in the Summer term.



- Homework to be in on Thursday and will be marked and returned Friday.
- Spellings 6 games on EdShed per week
- Weekly spellings to learn for a spelling test in school
- Times tables TTRS 10 mins minimum



Reading expectations

- Children should read to an adult at least 3 times a week.
- Three comments per week in their reading record book by an adult.

Rewards and sanctions

- Positive behaviour is praised and house points given.
- We are using a trauma informed approach
- Behaviour is managed on an individual basis
- Consequences will be in line with behaviour policy

Lunch and break times



Break time in Year 3 and 4 is at 10:00am.

Lunch time for Year 3 and 4 is at 12.30pm- 1.30pm.

Children should bring a clear bottle for water only for their drink in the classroom.

Children can continue to purchase tuck from the kitchen at breaktime

Or they can bring one healthy snack for break.
